RC boat "Dennis Conner" monthly report by Colleen Cooke Wood rot repair along port side of main cabin mostly completed and removal of black mold and repair of onboard refrigerator repurposed as an ice box with adequate drainage coupler had sheered off transmission while transmission was in shop it was inspected and looked great Downing Family Foundation is likely to offer a grant to assist in paying these bills
- h. SDAYC Awards Ryan Rogers nominated Chris Seidel for Peter M. Curtin Sportsman Award Ryan to talk to Rich about how to submit the nomination Jerry might submit Bob Madruga for rescue award
- i. Add the USSA Safety Equipment Requirements (SERs) to all CRA races, based on either *Nearshore* or *Coastal* courses *Motion: Commodore's Cup will be near shore discussion Vote: YES 7, NO 3, Abstain 1*

Ryan Rogers suggests the following list of Coastal SER requirements be dropped

- a. 2.5.1 Dewatering Pumps A boat shall have a permanently installed manual bilge pump of at least a 10 GPM (37.8 liter per minute) capacity and which is operable from on deck with the cabin closed with the discharge not dependent on an open hatch. Unless permanently attached to the pump, the bilge pump handle shall be securely attached to the boat in its vicinity via a lanyard or catch. A bilge pump discharge shall not be connected to a cockpit drain. The bilge pump shall not discharge into a cockpit unless that cockpit opens aft to the sea.
- b. 3.1.4 Harness Each crewmember shall have a safety harness and compatible safety tether not more than 6'7"(2m) long with a minimum tensile strength of 4500 Ib. (20kN). The tether shall have a snap hook at its far end and a means to quickly disconnect the tether at the chest end.
- c. 3.2.1 Jackline A boat shall carry jacklines with a breaking strength of at least 4500 lb. (20kN) which allow the crew to reach all points on deck, connected to similarly strong attachment points, in place while racing.

- d. 3.7.1 Crew Overboard Sling A boat shall carry a Lifesling or equivalent man overboard rescue device equipped with a self-igniting light stored on deck and ready for immediate use.
- e. 3.7.2 Crew Overboard Equipment A boat shall have a man overboard pole and flag, with a lifebuoy, a self-igniting light, a whistle, and a drogue attached. A self-inflating Man Overboard Module, Dan Buoy or similar device will satisfy this requirement. Self-inflating apparatus shall be tested and serviced in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. These items shall be stored on deck, ready for immediate use, and affixed in a manner that allows for a "quick release".
- f. 3.8.1 Fixed Mount VHF A boat shall have a permanently installed 25-watt VHF radio connected to a masthead antenna by a co-axial feeder cable with no more than a 40% power loss. Such radio shall have DSC capability, have an antenna of at least 15" (381mm) in length, be connected to or have an internal GPS, and have the assigned MMSI number (unique to the boat) programed into the VHF.
- g. 3.9 AIS All boats shall have an AIS Transponder, sharing a masthead VHF antenna via a low loss AIS antenna splitter. An acceptable alternative is a dedicated AIS antenna that is a minimum of 0.9 meters long, mounted with its base at least 3 meters above the water, and fed with coax that has a maximum 40% power loss. AIS requirement for Coastal is effective January 1, 2024.
- h. 3.15 Crew Overboard Button A boat shall carry an electronic means to record the position of a man overboard within ten seconds. This may be the same instrument listed in 3.14.
- i. 3.16.2 EPIRB / PLB A boat shall carry either a 406MHz EPIRB which is properly registered to the boat, or a floating 406MHz Personal Locator Beacon, registered to the owner with a notation in the registration that it is aboard the boat. This device shall be equipped with an internal GPS
- j. 3.18 Depth Sounder A boat shall have a permanently installed depth sounder that can measure to depths of at least 200 ft. (61m).
- k. 3.20 Charts A boat shall have non-electronic charts that are appropriate for the race area.
- 1. 3.33.1 Mainsail Reefing A boat shall have a mainsail reefing capable of reducing the luff length by at least 10%
- m. 4.3.2 Safety at Sea Training

- a. Holy Toledo West owner has not replied to CRA request to inspect the boat concerning SERs required for the Commodore's Cup Holy Toledo West's has asked for a redress hearing concerning the Commodore's. It is scheduled for 8/13 Concerning response to email from Tim Forderer, owner of Holy Toledo West Commodore Chuck Bowers will respond by email saying: "CRA intends to follow the procedures and guideline prescribed by U S Sailing"
- b. Given Ho to be given the award for being winner of 10 of 10 during the Beer Cans at SharpHospice Regatta
- c. Concerning handicap ratings for our racers for next year *Motion: move away from ORR EZ and move to ORC Club Vote: YES unanimous*
- d. Next year boats planning to race with a spinnaker must use ORC Club ratings except those using ORR (boats normally racing in what has been recently Class Zero very fast/large boats like Stag Hound) or those racing one design *Vote: YES unanimous*
