Formal Donation Proposal from Project Bluewater Racing to Cortez Racing Association

Promoting Affordable Accessible Sailboat Fleet Racing and Match Racing Opportunities in San Diego Bay

October 9, 2025

Introduction

On behalf of Project Bluewater Racing (PBWR) a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, we are pleased to submit this formal proposal outlining our intent to donate \$50,000 to the Cortez Racing Association (CRA) before financial year end December 31, 2025.

Project Bluewater Racing is a San Diego based 501(c)(3) non-profit dedicated to empowering young adults through competitive sailboat racing, advancing marine science research, and leading sustainability initiatives that protect our marinas, harbors, and oceans. EIN Number: 20-1685136

PBWR recognizes CRA's longstanding commitment as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization to making sailboat racing affordable for the San Diego community. Our organizations share a vision of fostering education, inclusivity, and growth within the sport of sailing. We believe this partnership will further strengthen CRA's mission and extend meaningful opportunities for public participation on San Diego Bay.

Donation Details

The total donation of \$50,000 is to be allocated as follows:

• \$10,000 to support CRA's general funds, ensuring the continuity and sustainability of your core programs and operations.

- \$5,000 dedicated to educational scholarships, specifically for individuals pursuing sailing training and related educational opportunities. This allocation intends to break down barriers for aspiring sailors and promote diversity in the sport.
- \$35,000 earmarked for the development and launch of a Public Access Match Racing program
 in San Diego Bay, aimed at providing access and education for participants of all experience
 levels to learn match racing skills.

Public Access Match Racing Program

The centerpiece of this proposal is the establishment of a Public Access Match Racing program. This initiative is designed to open the world of match racing to the broader San Diego community, encouraging participation from youth, adults, and underrepresented groups. Under this program, CRA will retain ownership of all assets procured through the donation, including vessels and related equipment. Project Bluewater Racing will assume responsibility for vessel management and provide experienced coaching staff to ensure the program's smooth operation and the highest standards of safety and instruction. All program activities will be conducted for the public benefit, in alignment with both organizations shared values.

Benefits and Community Impact

This donation is intended to bolster CRA's capacity to deliver on its mission of providing affordable sailboat racing in San Diego. By supporting general operations, funding educational scholarships, and launching the Public Access Match Racing program, this partnership will:

- Expand opportunities for community members to learn and compete in sailing.
- Provide public access to match racing, with an emphasis on inclusivity and education.
- Strengthen CRA's position as a leading non-profit in the region's sailing community.
- Deliver lasting benefits to the San Diego area by promoting healthy, outdoor recreation and fostering a sense of community on the water.
- Provide public access to a One Design match racing fleet with qualified coaching helping skippers and crews improve boat handling, enhancing safety for all racers.

Additional Considerations and Ideas

- Project Bluewater Racing considers the proposed donation to Cortez Racing Association ethical and compliant with IRS rules for non-profit contributions, benefiting both its members and the public.
- Cortez Racing Association would be responsible for overseeing the accounts used to process payments related to the donation from Project Bluewater Racing.
- Project Bluewater Racing would agree to manage scheduling and logistics of the Public Match Racing program and assume all legal liability.
- Project Bluewater Racing leadership will require Cortez Racing Association's assistance in lobbying local and state officials for grant funding for a Public Sailing Center located on San Diego Bay.
- Initial requirement for the Public Match Racing program would be for dock space and a parking space for the PBWR 26-foot maintenance trailer used for vessel and program management.

- PBWR will assign a person to collect data from marinas around San Diego Bay about logistical feasibility and will provide information necessary for evaluating the establishment of a Public Match Racing program base.
- It could be feasible for two J24 owners to lease their vessels to the Public Match Racing program. PBWR would install bow, corner bumpers and extension poles on the sterns for collision prevention.
- CRA could purchase/lease a small Whaler or RIB to serve as coach/umpire boat.

Conclusion and Next Steps

Project Bluewater Racing is excited to partner with the Cortez Racing Association in this endeavor. We respectfully request the CRA Board's consideration and approval of this proposal. Upon acceptance, we will coordinate with CRA leadership to finalize the donation, develop implementation timelines, and establish program guidelines to ensure transparency and the highest impact for all stakeholders. Thank you for your dedication to making sailboat racing accessible and affordable in San Diego. We look forward to working together to expand opportunities and strengthen the community through this important initiative.
