Addendum PBWR

Written response to PBWR's November proposal:

As you are aware, the Cortez Racing Association (CRA) is an Organizing Authority that puts on 12 monthly regattas and 10 Beer Can races each year. Our membership is primarily boat owners who join CRA to race their own boats. We fulfill our mission statement by "offering interesting race events and social activities for a modest annual fee" to our membership.

The CRA board is all volunteer and structured to support the monthly regatta and Beer Can races we offer. The addition of a match racing program and the ownership of race boats by CRA is a huge expansion of scope to our current operations and our core mission. This expanded scope and boat ownership would simply overwhelm the board and dilute our ability to execute our core mission. As such, we respectfully decline to accept any money directed toward the match racing program and partnership that PBWR envisions.

Further, the CRA board must remain an independent body, free to always act in the best interest of our membership. As such the CRA board cannot become contractually obligated to act on behalf of another organization or form partnerships that compromise CRA's independence.

The CRA board may be able to help with the educational aspect of the PBWR proposal by managing the disbursement of scholarships in the 2026 calendar year, subject to review. However, CRA must remain fully independent in this regard. As such, the criteria used to make the awards and choose the recipients will be at the sole discretion of CRA.

CRA does want to continue our good relationship with PBWR and support, as we are able, the match racing endeavour. PBWR's vision for match racing in San Diego bay is a worthy cause and would be of great benefit to the local sailing community. CRA wishes PBWR much success.
